In addition to the annual physical, we are requiring families to discuss the pros and cons of attending camp this summer during the pandemic with the camper's primary care physician. The discussion should include reviewing the camper's health history, every household member's health history, and the procedures listed below.

- Camper check-in/check-out will be streamlined.
- If your camper has **medications**, please make arrangements with our nurse, Jessica Seldon (330.644.4512 or [jessies@akronymca.org](mailto:jessies@akronymca.org)), to make an appointment in advance to review the medications that will be administered at camp. Only one parent/guardian is permitted to drop off/pick up your camper. If possible, do not bring siblings or other family members.
- Staff will wear **facemasks** as much as possible, especially when the cabin group is indoors, while serving food, assisting with activities of daily living and personal hygiene, and when they cannot be socially distant. Staff should not wear masks while doing strenuous activities, such as swimming, running, and playing outdoor games. Campers are not required to wear facemasks but can if they choose to.
- Campers will be in their cabin groups for all activities this summer and there will not be any mingling with other cabins. Swim time, meal times, and all activities will be isolated to the cabin group. **Cabin groups will not be larger than six campers and two counselors.**
- Extra emphasis will be placed on **handwashing** this summer. While it has always been an important part of the camp experience, we will be having hand washing breaks throughout the day. Extra staff will be here to support campers throughout this process.
- Common spaces, such as our dining hall, craft room, and sensory area, will be **cleaned between groups.**
- **Temperature checks will occur daily** for all campers and staff. Anyone with a temperature over 100 degrees will be isolated until they can go home. If someone tests positive for COVID-19 we will notify all families in that cabin group that there may be a possible exposure and require a negative COVID-19 test before returning to camp. Additionally, we will also notify the health department and follow their recommended guidance.
